

# Consumer Health Data Privacy Policy

This Consumer Health Data Privacy Policy (this “Policy”) is an integral part of our Notice at Collection and Supplemental U.S. Patients and HCPs Privacy Policy and is applicable to residents of Washington and Nevada (“you”, “your”). This Policy describes how we use and process your information, which is linked or reasonably linkable to an individual and that identifies the consumer’s past, present or future physical or mental health status as described in more detail in this Policy (“Consumer Health Data”) under applicable US state health data privacy laws, including but not limited to Washington’s My Health My Data Act, Nevada’s Consumer Health Data Privacy Law, and other applicable U.S. state health data privacy laws that may go into effect from time to time (“Applicable Health Privacy Laws”).

## Collection of Consumer Health Data:

The categories of Consumer Health Data we collect depend on how you interact with us, the services or products that you might use, and the requirements of applicable law. Examples of categories of Consumer Health Data we may collect from you include:

- Health conditions, treatments, diseases, or diagnoses, both past and current family health history
- Social, psychological, behavioral, or medical interventions
- Health-related surgeries or procedures
- Use or purchase of prescribed medication
- Use or purchase of other medications, supplements, or substances (not prescribed)
- Bodily functions, vital signs, symptoms, or measurements
- Diagnoses or diagnostic testing results, treatment, or medication
- Self-reported health information
- Gender-affirming care information
- Reproductive or sexual health care information
- Biometric information
- Genetic information
- Healthcare utilization information (appointments, hospitalizations, discharge/admission dates, specialties and providers seen)
- Health service costs and payment information
- Precise location information that could reasonably indicate your attempt to acquire or receive health services or supplies
- Information that could identify your attempt to seek health care services

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- Any inferences of the above categories of health data derived or extrapolated from non-health information

## Sources of Consumer Health Data

We may collect Consumer Health Data in the different ways:

- directly from you if, for example, you contact us through website contact form, or call us to report an adverse event or request medical information.
- indirectly from other sources, such as public available sources, doctors who prescribe our product to you, the study investigator engaged into our study research, or other third parties.

## How we use and share Consumer Health Data

As described in more detail in our Notice at Collection and Supplemental U.S. Patients and HCPs Privacy Policy, your Consumer Health Data may be used to advance our clinical research, address your inquiries relating to any medical information and to provide our products and services to you, comply with regulatory requirements to which we are subject, such as safety adverse effect reporting, improve or develop products and services, for administrative purposes related to the operation and management of our business, for legal purposes, such as to prevent and respond to fraud or other illegal activities or enforce our agreements and policies, and for other business purposes as permitted by Applicable Health Privacy Laws.

We may deidentify Consumer Health Data and use the deidentified data as permitted by applicable law. We will not attempt to reidentify the data, except as permitted by applicable law.

As described in more detail in our Notice at Collection and Supplemental U.S. Patients and HCPs Privacy Policy, we may share and disclose your Consumer Health Data to the following recipients:

- Our affiliates, specifically SERB SAS, Protherics Medicines Development Ltd;
- Business partners and service providers, such as a Contract Research Organization for supporting clinical study or data hosting provider;
- Public and government authorities;

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- Parties in connection with a business transaction, such as a merger, asset sale, financing, or other transaction.

We do not “sell” any Consumer Health Data, as defined in the Applicable Health Privacy Laws.

## Individual Rights

As per Applicable Health Privacy Laws, you may make certain requests to exercise your privacy rights with respect to your Consumer Health Data, including a right to know whether we collect and share your Consumer Health Data, with whom we have shared your Consumer Health Data and their contact information, and rights to confirm, access or obtain a copy, amend, delete or withdraw consent relating to such data, subject to certain exceptions. Please see our Notice at Collection and Supplemental U.S. Patients and HCPs Privacy Policy for additional information.

To submit a request for exercising your data rights or lodge an appeal about our decision, please contact our Group DPO at [DPO@serb.com](mailto:DPO@serb.com) . We may request additional information to verify your identity and confirm that your Consumer Health Data is in our systems.

The Company reserves the rights to change and update this Policy at any time. If there are any material changes to this Policy, we will notify you as required by applicable law. You understand and agree that you will be deemed to have accepted the updated Policy if you continue to use our products and services after the new Policy takes effect.
